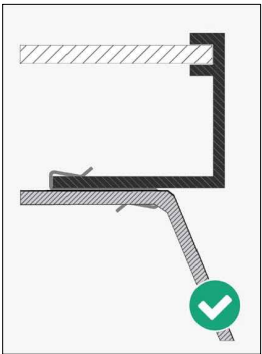
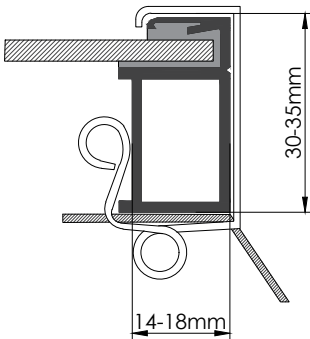


BB-200 valid for $115 \leq X \leq 190$ mm, where X is the maximum height of the module in relation to the tiles, irrespective of the type of tile and fixing or product, as shown in the following example:



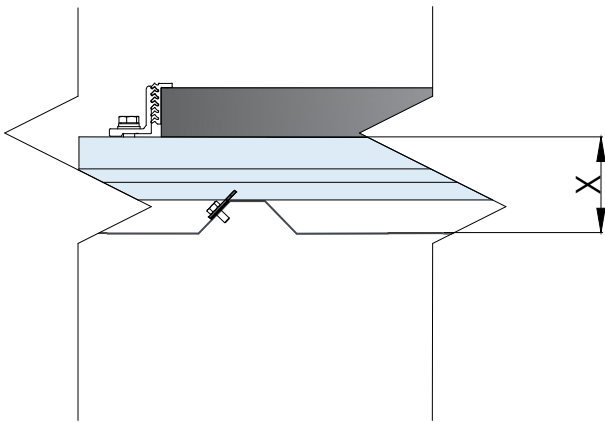
Correct positioning of the product using the included clamps for open profile panel frames: the BB must be fixed using 8 clamps per metre, placing 1 clamp on each strip joint and 2 clamps between joints.



Correct positioning of the product by means of the optional BBClip (not included) for closed profile panel frames; there are two sizes to choose from, depending on the module frame dimensions:

- 11x30x14-18 mm
- 11x35x14-18 mm

The BB must be fixed with 8 clips per metre, 4 on each strip, between joints.



The optional BBTool (not included) is recommended for faster and more efficient installation.



The BB-200 is recommended for all coplanar products, especially tile products and continuous rail metal roof products, but also microrail products if $115 \leq X$.

In any case, it must be checked that X is < 190 mm.

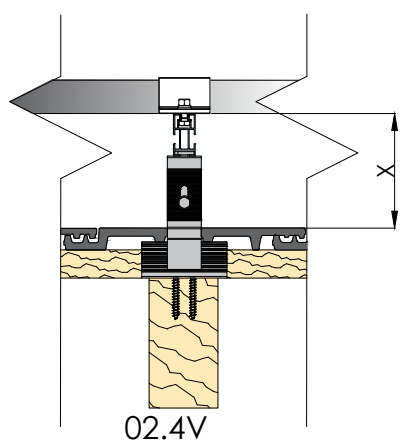
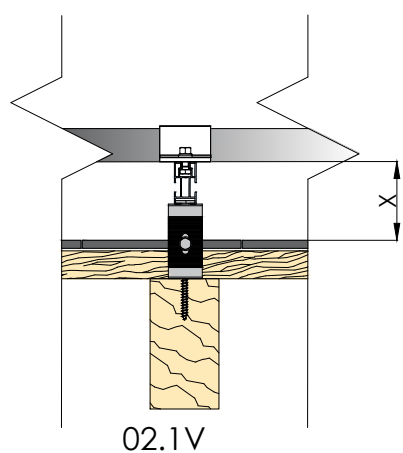
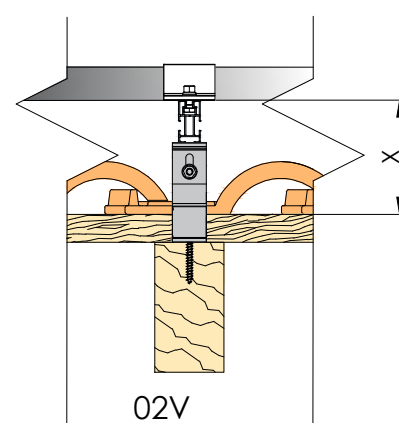
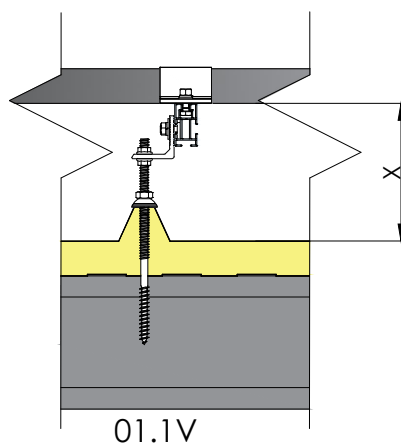
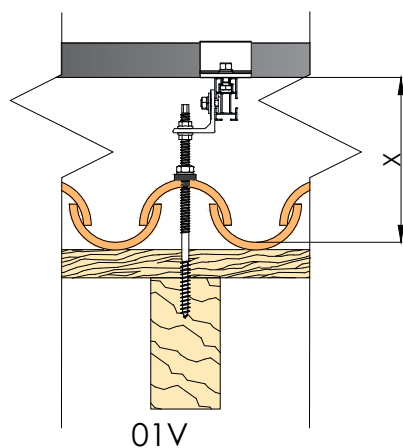

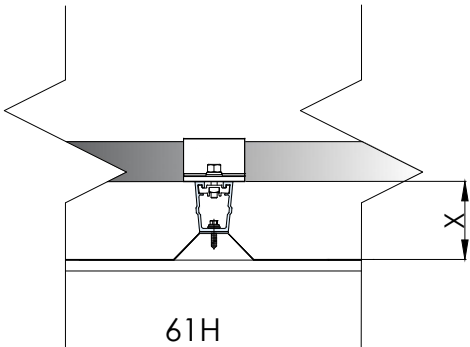
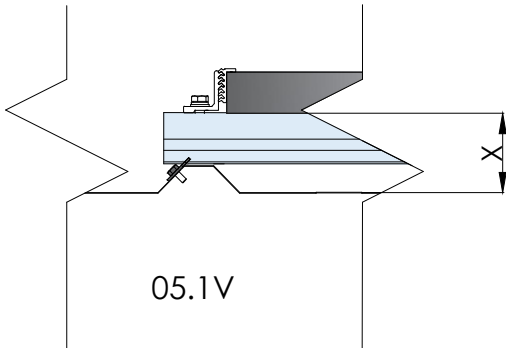
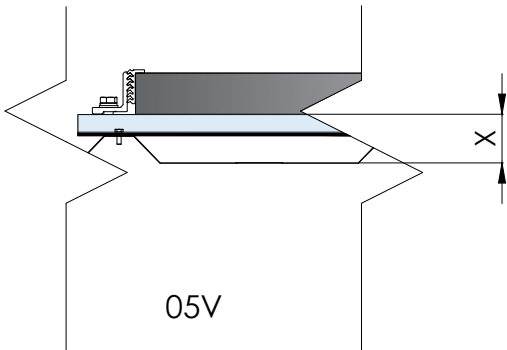
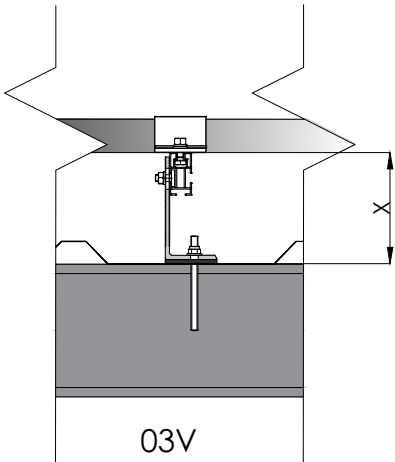
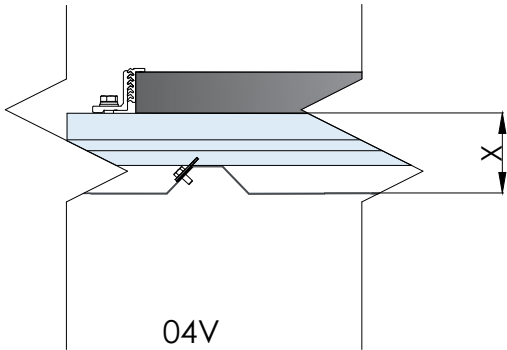
Description	BirdBlocker 200 mm needle. Accessory for blocking the passage of birds under the panels.

Graphical examples of the maximum module height with respect to the roof, X, to be measured for the choice of BB, on different tiles and roofs, in the various coplanar product fixings:





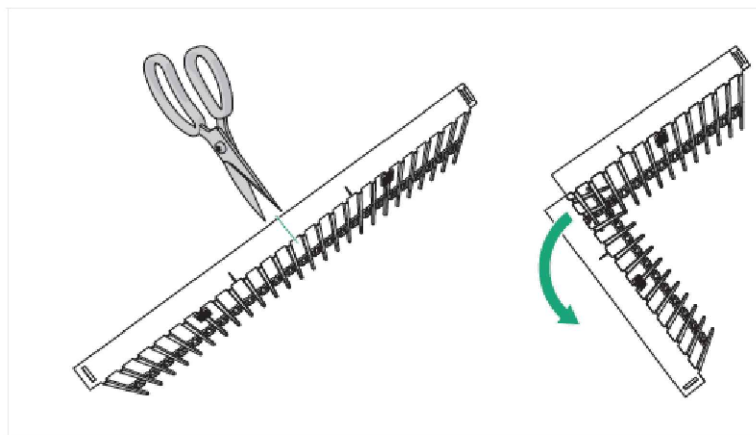
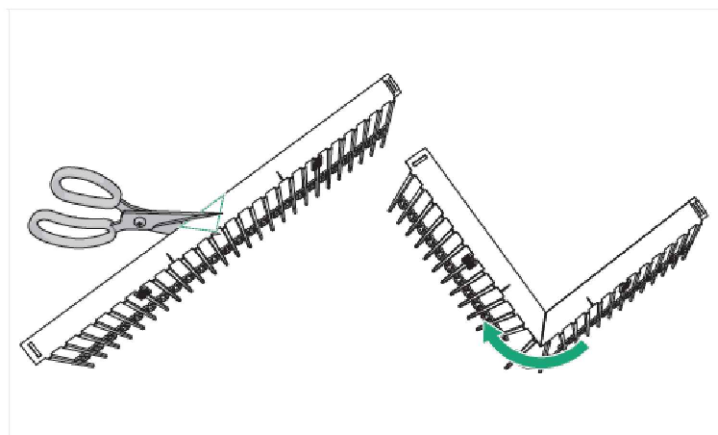

Assembly:

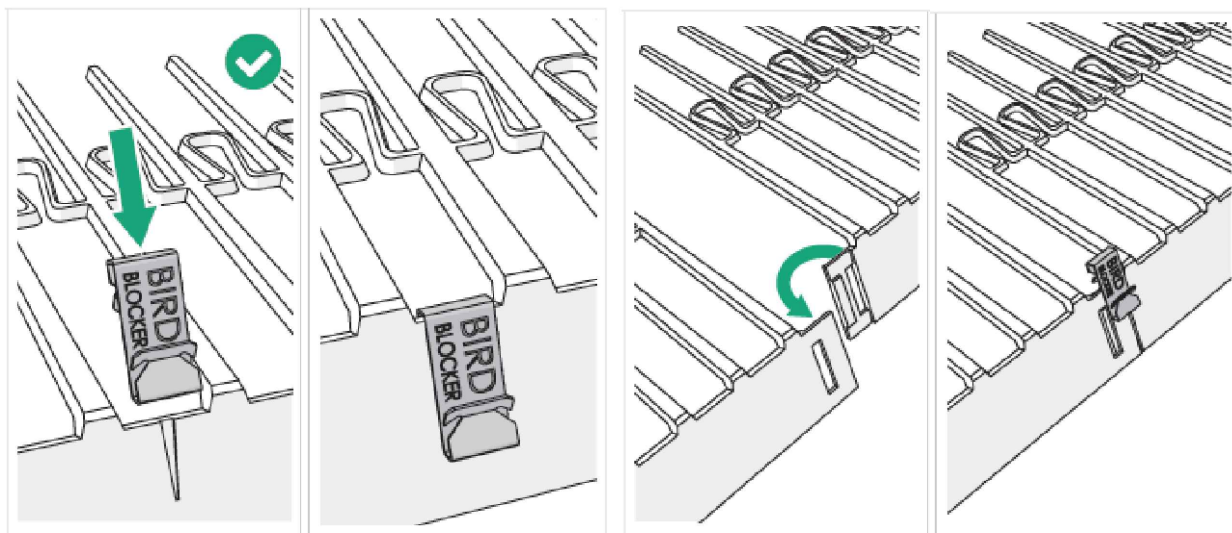
1. Trim the needles to the height of $X + 1$ cm:



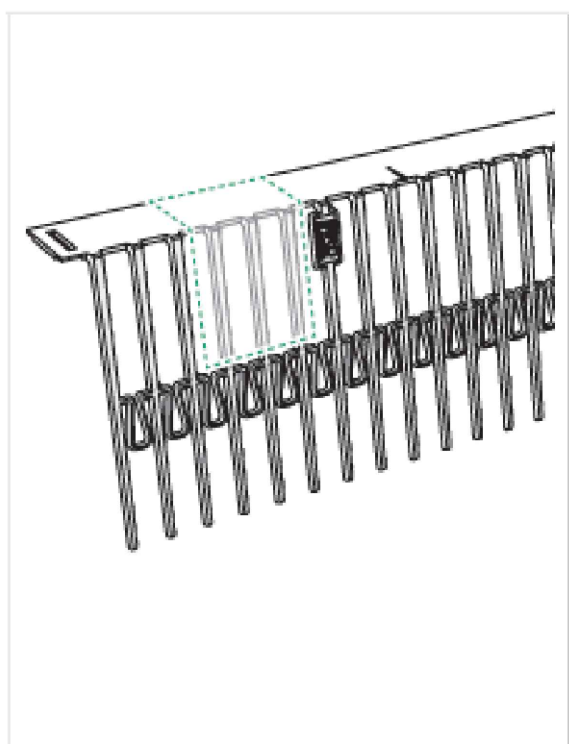
2. Trim and fold the strips to form the outer and inner corners:



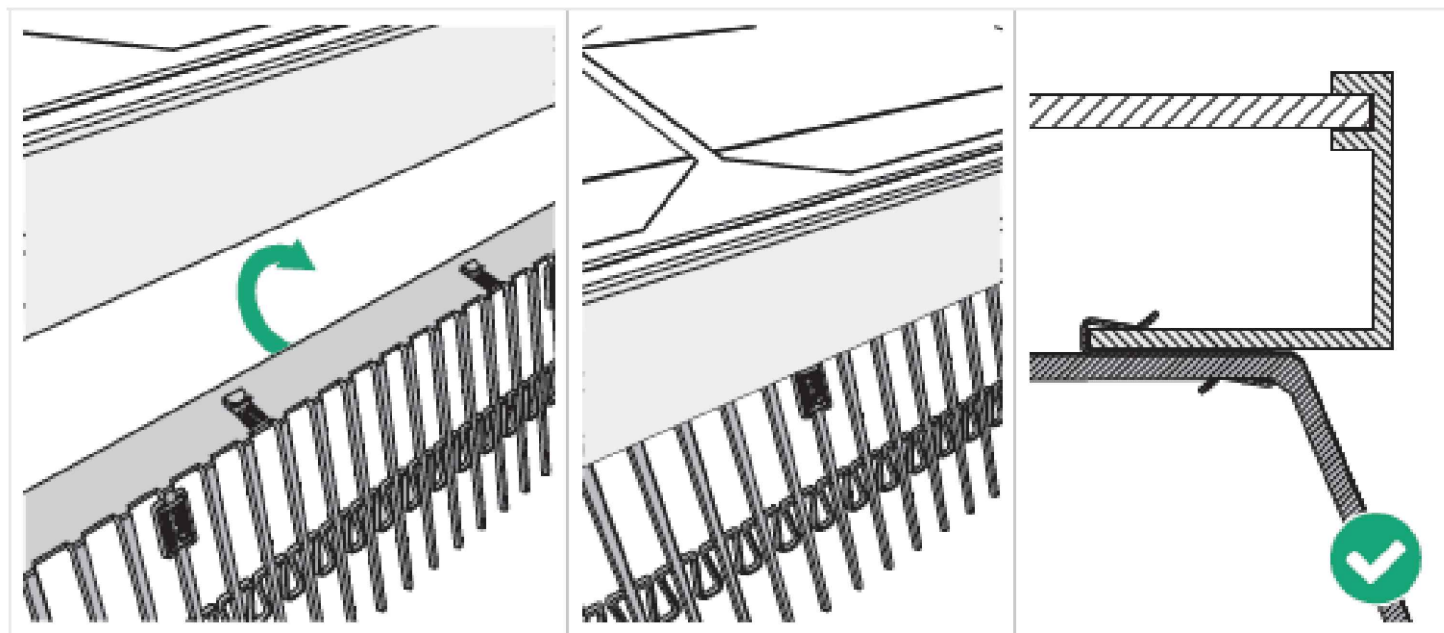
3. Place the clips on the marks on the strips and on the joints with the logo facing upwards:



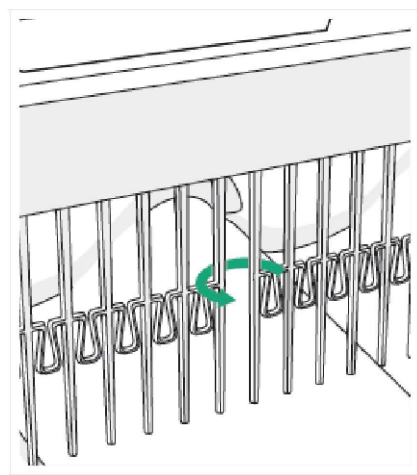
4. Cut out holes for the panel fastening profiles:



5. Fix the strips to the module frames using the clips:



6. Connect the loose strips with the plastic ties:



* If the frame of the modules is a closed profile, the same procedure must be followed, replacing the clips with BBClips, using 4 clips per strip, between joints; for this purpose, due to the small width of the panel frames, it is necessary to cut 4 triangular segments from the rear BB strip:
